How many sex offenders are in my zip code

Find Out More When it comes to protecting your children, there are certain measures no one wants to think about taking, but parents often find themselves exploring simply as a precaution. Among these may be researching sex offenders in your neighborhood, especially if you're moving to a new home or preparing for Halloween, a holiday when your child will be knocking on countless doors in the neighborhood. Given alarming stats like that, you want to be aware of this info when planning what route your kids will take to get to their bus stop or school, going into trick-or-treating season, or ahead of moving to a new area. Really, no matter the specific reason, having this kind of data at your fingertips can be an empowering way to protect your children. Here, six expert-suggested tips for finding sex offenders in your neighborhood. Heading to nsopw.gov—coordinated by the Department of Justice—is the first step to identifying sex offenders in your community. "The NSOPW is a public safety resource that provides the public with access to sex offender data nationwide," explains Margaret Arsenault CEO of the nonprofit Face2Face Youth Group. "Users can search for sex offenders in any jurisdiction within the United States, including Native American tribal jurisdictions. NSOPW's search tool provides information about sex offenders through a number of search options, including searching by name, address, by zip code, by county, and city or town. Each of these options is dependent upon the jurisdiction in question providing the information in its own publicly accessible database." Familywatchdog.us allows parents to type in their zip and see a map of sex offenders in their neighborhood. They also offer free notifications that help keep you updated with offenders who move in/out of your area. Every state maintains its own registry, notes Arsenault. For instance, in California, it's the Megan's Law site, named for a federal law, and informal name for subsequent state laws, requiring law enforcement authorities to make information available to the public regarding registered sex offenders. In Seattle, it's You can access a list of individual state registries on the FBI's website, or through your county's local sheriff's office or police department. "The publicly-accessible registries allow you to view the address which a sex offender has listed in their compulsory registration," Arsenault notes. "Some sex offenders neglect to register when they're supposed to, including mandatory updates. [For example,] in California they must update their registration annually or any time they change their residence, which also includes incarceration." RELATED: 11 Best Apps for Parents to Monitor Their Kids "Offenders regularly decide not to register," warns Christy Keating, owner and lead educator at Savvy Parents Safe Kids, LLC. "When this happens, their case is typically referred to prosecutors to file a failure to register charge, but it may take weeks, months, or in some cases, years before they are apprehended." Clearly, finding sex offenders who haven't registered can be more challenging, Arsenault says. "Essentially, one could do a public search for addresses associated with a particular person, but you'd have to have some information about the person you wanted to search for," she explains. "Knowing, at the very least, the name, age, sex, and race, will make the search much easier. In other words, you have to know who you're searching for." "Around Halloween, Patch.com also routinely provides safe trick-or-treating maps for many communities around the country," shares Keating. These maps take sex offenders' locations into consideration. "Online registries can give parents a false sense of security," warns Keating. "Many offenders have simply never been caught and/or prosecuted and/or convicted, and this means that vigilance and smarts are important." Our Crimes Against Children Unit at FBI Headquarters coordinated the development of the National Sex Offenders Registry (NSOR), which is currently managed by the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services Division.The Pam Lychner Sexual Offender Tracking and Identification Act of 1996 (Lychner Act) required the Attorney General to establish a national database at the FBI to track the whereabouts and movements of certain convicted sex offenders under Title 42 of the United States Code Section 14072. The National Crime Information Center (NCIC) run by the FBI enables the NSOR to retain the offender's current registered address and dates of registration, conviction, and residence.The Lychner Act imposed two major obligations on the FBI that became effective October 3, 1997:To establish a national database that tracks the location and movements of each person who has been convicted of a criminal offense against a victim who is a minor, has been convicted of a sexually violent offense, or is a sexually violent predator.To register and verify the addresses of sex offenders who reside in states without a "minimally sufficient" sex offender registry (SOR) program. Today, all 50 states have minimally sufficient SOR programs.Under the Act, the FBI may release relevant information to federal, state, and local criminal justice agencies for law enforcement purposes only. Public notification will only be made if it is necessary to protect the public. However, the Act specifically states that in no case shall the FBI release the identity of any victim of an offense that required registration of a sex offender.The legislation also made it a criminal offense for a registered sex offender to move to another state and knowingly fail to notify the FBI and authorities in the new state. Notification to the FBI and state authorities must be made within 10 days upon moving to a new state and/or establishing residence following release from prison or placed on parole, supervised release, or probation. Upon release, each sex offender is notified of their lawful duty to register with the FBI and appropriate local authorities.The Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexual Violent Offender Registration Program, enacted in 1994, provides a financial incentive for states to establish registration programs for persons who have been convicted of certain sex crimes.Megan's Law, enacted in May 1996, amended the Wetterling Program legislation to give states broad discretion to determine to whom notification should be made about offenders, under what circumstances, and about which offenders. Maybe you're trying to mail a letter but only have the recipient's street address. Perhaps you've received mail from a stranger and want to narrow down where the letter came from. Whatever your reasons for needing to do so, finding a ZIP code isn't hard — if you know where to look.What Is a ZIP Code?ZIP codes were first introduced in the United States during World War II in 1943. At the time, the postal service was looking for ways to simplify the way it did business due to so many employees having left to serve in the war effort. The postal service needed simplification since so many employees left to serve. The Zone Improvement Plan (ZIP), as it was known, made it easier to identify where a letter needed to go, which in turn simplified the delivery process for postal employees. Initially, the Zone Improvement Plan used two-digit numbers. The first denoted a major city — smaller cities and towns were only added later — while the second denoted the state that city was in. As the number of people and cities grew, more numbers were added. Today, the first digit represents a large area. For instance, zero stands for the Northeast, while nine represents much of the west. The second and third digits signify a regional central post office, while the fourth and fifth digits represent a smaller postal zoneOne example offered by Business Insider is the ZIP code 10014. The first number tells you that the address is in either Delaware, Pennsylvania or New York. The two zeros mean that the regional post office is New York Sectional Center. Finally, the 14 places the letter's destination in Manhattan's West Village. Not bad for five seemingly random numbers.Looking Up Zip CodesOnce upon a time, your choices for looking up a ZIP code were pretty much to hope it was in your phone book or ask someone who lived near the recipient and pray that they shared an area code. With the internet, however, finding ZIP codes is easy.Photo Courtesy: Joe Sohm/Visions of America You can use a tool on the U.S. Postal Service's website to look up the area code of either a specific address or a particular city. Similarly, you can enter in an unknown ZIP code and find out the city it corresponds to. (Just be aware that many cities have multiple ZIP codes).There are many other online tools, such as those at Zip-Codes.com and UnitedStatesZipCodes.org, that serve a similar function. However, looking up a ZIP code doesn't even have to be as complicated as that. A simple search on Google or other large search engine is likely to reveal the location tied to a ZIP code and vice versa. In fact, this even holds true with telephone area codes.How to Find a ZIP + 4 CodeYou've probably ZIP codes with an extra four numbers at the end, but it may not be clear what they actually do — after all, mail seems to get where it needs to go regardless of whether or not those numbers are there. While it's true that they're not essential, they do serve a purpose.Photo Courtesy: Robert Alexander/Getty Images These numbers represent something even more specific: the particular delivery route to the destination, as well as around 20 or so homes, businesses or other locations. By including those extra four digits, you help the U.S. Postal Service sort the mail more efficiently and speed up the delivery of your letter or package. If you're in a particular hurry for your mail to arrive at its destination, you can find the latter part of a ZIP code using the tool on the U.S. Postal Service's website above (as well as many similar sites) so long as you know the address of the location you're looking for. When you use the USPS look-up tool at Tools.USPS.com, you'll also get the ZIP + 4 code along with the five-digit code.
